

MINUTES
Lake Ordinances Review Committee
(Town of Oakland & Lake District Boards)
July 7, 2004

The meeting of the Lake Ordinances Review Committee started at 7:00 p.m. at the Lake District office. Committee members present included Paul Jorstad, John Molinaro and Dennis McCarthy. Lynn Anderson was absent. Paul Dearlove was present to record minutes and serve as technical consultant.

McCarthy moved to approve the minutes of the committee's 6/9/04 meeting. Molinaro seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

The committee discussed amending its earlier recommendation to the Town of Oakland regarding a new fee structure for the public boat landing. Dearlove explained why the approved motion from the last meeting did not fully conform to the requirements set forth in s. 30.77, Wis. Stats. Committee members agreed that the recommended fee structure should be revised to satisfy existing state standards. *McCarthy moved to recommend that the Town of Oakland amend Ordinance #2 to reflect the following fee structure:*

Sticker fees	Annual	Daily

WI resident	\$20.00	\$ 5.00
WI resident age 65 or older	\$10.00	\$ 3.00
Non-resident	\$30.00	\$10.00

Molinaro seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

Discussion on how to identify and protect environmentally sensitive areas in the Town of Oakland was tabled until the next meeting.

Molinaro moved to recommend that the Town of Oakland create an ordinance or amend existing Ordinance #42 to prohibit any new boat ramps on Lake Ripley. McCarthy seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

McCarthy moved to recommend that the Town of Oakland amend Ordinance #2 to add a slow-no-wake buoyed restricted area within a fixed 200-foot distance from the shoreline of Lake Ripley, and to redefine the slow-no-wake buoyed restricted area for South (Marina) Bay to include all water south of a line connecting the south property lines of parcels 022-0613-0833-001 and 022-0613-0743-025. Molinaro seconded. Motion carried 3-0.

The next committee meeting was set for Wednesday, August 4, 2004, from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m. at the Lake District office. Agenda topics will include waterfront zoning and marinas; Town of Oakland environmentally sensitive areas; ordinance enforcement; and a review of committee recommendations and how they should be presented to the Town Board.

Molinaro moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:15 p.m. McCarthy seconded. Motion carried 3-0.
